



WINTER FACT SHEET

LOCATION:	Schweitzer is perched 2,000 feet above the picturesque town of Sandpoint and Lake Pend Oreille. Located 90 miles from Spokane, Wash. in the rugged Selkirk Mountains of Idaho's panhandle, Schweitzer is a convenient two-hour drive from the Spokane International Airport and six-hours from the Seattle Metro area.
ABOUT SCHWEITZER:	Schweitzer boasts 2,900 acres of skiable terrain, offering a mix of high angle groomers, gladed tree runs and wide-open bowl skiing and riding. Schweitzer's size as the largest mountain resort in Idaho isn't the only standout feature. Schweitzer's intimate mountain village offers a year-round mix of family-friendly activities, dining, spa, and slopeside lodging. Soak in 360-degree views of neighboring mountain ranges in Montana, Washington, and Canada from the summit, and enjoy best-in-class skiing at one of the Pacific Northwest's favorite mountains.
WINTER SEASON:	Late November to mid-April, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily.
TWILIGHT SKIING:	3 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays from Jan. 6-March 4 as well as select holidays. The Basin Express and Creekside Express high-speed quads are both available during twilight skiing.
ACREAGE:	Schweitzer offer 2,900 acres of skiable terrain with 92 trails.

GROOMING:	Schweitzer offers at least one groomed run off each chairlift daily.
TERRAIN PARKS:	Schweitzer offers two terrain parks, Stomping Grounds, and The Terrain Garden.

ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES:	Cambium Spa, snow tubing at Hermit's Hollow, Nordic skiing, NASTAR, snowshoeing, snow biking, kids' night out, kids' craft pails, cat skiing, snowmobile tours and scenic chairlift rides
PASS PROGRAM:	Schweitzer is part of the Alterra Mountain Company family and a member of the Ikon Pass community.
LODGING:	Schweitzer has a diverse bed base, including a number of condos and the 31-room ski-in/ski-out boutique hotel, Humbird, which opened in 2022.
ON-MOUNTAIN DINING:	Schweitzer offers four on-mountain dining options including grab-and-go options from the Rowdy Grouse, cafeteria style dining at The Outback and Red Hawk Café and intimate mountain top dining with 360-degree views at The Nest. In addition, the village expands the selection to 11 different dining locations
SIGNATURE EVENTS:	Schweitzer offers a robust events schedule each winter. Signature events include Ski with Santa as well as fireworks and live music over MLK and President's weekends. Each year, the season wraps up with Schpring Finale featuring a Cardboard Box Derby, fundraiser for the local rotary, costumes and prizes.
HISTORY:	Schweitzer opened on Dec. 4, 1963 with one chairlift. Over the coming years, Schweitzer expanded from its modest beginnings and by the turn of the century included multiple lifts, a day lodge and condos. In the aughts, Schweitzer continued to grow and soon introduced the first six-person chairlift in the state, new base area dining options and in 2005 with a 400-acre expansion it officially became the largest resort in the state. In the last five years, more than \$75 million has been invested in Schweitzer including three new lifts, the boutique hotel Humbird and Cambium spa. In 2023, Schweitzer became part of Alterra Mountain Company.
